What is The Disability in Sport program?

The Disability in Sport (DIS) program advances access, inclusion, equality, respect, legitimacy and opportunity for people with disabilities in sport and in society. Through research, education and advocacy activities, Disability in Sport addresses the invisibility of people with disabilities.

THE INSTITUTE FOR INCLUSION AND EQUALITY

The institute is a unique one-day interactive training designed for public school educators who are committed to increasing the level of inclusion in their school. The institute provides concrete tools and strategies that allow participants to deliver inclusive services to students with disabilities. The adult educators will also be certified to disseminate the concepts they learned to their colleagues. After the institute each participant will receive 10 hours of technical assistance for their school. This assistance includes evaluation of each school with respect to their level of inclusion and development of actions to improve this level.

REGISTRATION & TUITION

- ◆ Tuition for the DIS Institute is \$25 per person. This fee includes certificate of completion, and a continental breakfast. Participants are eligible to receive seven PDPs from the Massachusetts Department of Education.
